Family Safety: to report Child Maltreatment or Vulnerable Adult Maltreatment call Cherokee Dispatch 828-497-4131 and ask to page the Family Safety Social Worker on call

Domestic Violence Program: the program will be staffed throughout the holiday weekend as usual. The main telephone number is (828) 359-6830. Calls to this number will be forwarded automatically to the program's on-call cellular phone

Community Health: for medical emergencies call 911, other emergencies (water, heat, food, etc.) call 828-359-6796

Home Health: a staff member is on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Please call 828-497-9163 and ask to speak with the Home Health Nurse on-call

Children's Dental: If your child has a dental emergency please seek care through the Cherokee Indian Hospital Emergency Department. If a child needs to contact their Orthodontist the phone numbers are; Dr. Black 828-277-7103, Dr. Haldeman or Dr. Irvine 828-274-8822
